In Scope


Hospice Palliative volunteers, that is those volunteers specifically recruited, screened, and trained by *community-based Hospice organizations*

These volunteers may work in a variety of settings, including visiting hospice, Hospital Palliative units, Hospices, and Long-Term Care
















A Competency is the performance of critical work functions using related knowledge, skills, and abilities

They are:

- Observable
- Measurable
- Relate to excellence in performance









Competencies can:

Inform

The development of an effective volunteer engagement strategy

Guide

The development of a volunteer training and assessment program

Lead

To the development of a provincial approach to education that better prepares hospice volunteers to meet both the needs of hospice clients and the requirements of a changing health care system

BC Community hospice administrators & managers/coordinators of volunteer

BC Community hospice volunteers working in various care settings

BC Association and regional federations for hospice organizations







The Process



- To align with the other BC Centre for Palliative Care frameworks Domains were combined
- However, unlike the other HCP frameworks did not create core, generalist, enhanced, or specialist categories of competency level/or expertise
- Did consider these as suited to volunteers who have direct patient contact (i.e. not necessarily those in administrative positions)













