Overview Summary Presentation & Discussion	Presentation Summary Meaghan Jackson is a Music Therapist and works at the Lumara Grief & Bereavement Care Society based in Parksville BC. Meghan runs an online group and sessions for children a tool, the video game Minecraft, to support them in their grief journey:	
	 "Lumaria: A Minecraft-Based Children's Grief Program". Session Learning Objectives: Learn the basics of Minecraft and the technical requirements for running the program. Understand the differences between Bedrock and Java Edition when creating a Minecraft Realm. Learn some of the therapeutic interventions that have been used and their 	
	outcomes. Some things we know about how children grieve: • "Puddle Jumping"; grieving children can seem to move in and out of their grief, a bit like they're jumping in and out of a puddle • Provide space for Creativity and Play • Meet them where they are: comfortable, safe, FUN	
	 Follow their lead: they are the experts Lumaria: A Minecraft-Based Children's Grief Program schedule: Spring Break > 2hrs, 5 days (Monday – Friday) Summer Camp > 2hrs, 5 days (Monday – Friday) Monthly Sessions > 2hrs, once a month, throughout the year 	

In Lumaria, children have an opportunity to share what they built. The sessions start with a (in the video game program) campfire chat at the Big Tree. There is a check-in and opportunity for them to share who they are remembering, and a chat about a chosen question of the day (favourite food/activity/colours etc.). The children can build things together, as well as personal memorials to their loved ones. Participants can visit whenever they want to (but permissions to build are turned off so builds stay safe). What do the kinds think?
